

Documentation required when applying for business permission visa to travel to Ireland

If you intend to move to Ireland to establish a business, you must first apply to the Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform for permission to do so. This must be done prior to applying for a visa, as an application for a business permission visa cannot be considered prior to the permission of the Minister being obtained.

The request for business permission should be addressed to:

Once you have obtained this permission, you should then submit your visa application.

1.	Online summary sheet, signed and dated by you, the applicant – please ensure online application has been fully completed	
2.	Your original passport, valid for at least 12 months	
3.	One recent passport size photo	
4.	Evidence of your permission to remain in the UK (stamp or sticker in passport or on other approved official document provided by the UK authorities)	
5.	Processing fee (postal order or bank draft made payable to the Embassy of Ireland or cash)	
6.	The original business permission letter from the Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform	
7.	For postal applications, a self addressed Special Delivery envelope for return of your passport and documents	

The Visa Officer reserves the right to request additional documentation, if required, in support of your application. The provision of all of the documentation listed in no way guarantees that a visa will be granted.
