PLEASE NOTE
**If you are travelling to Ireland without your EU family member
or your trip is not for the purpose of visiting
an EU family member who is residing in Ireland,
you are required to provide the necessary documents
as listed in the Visit Visa Checklist.**

| 1. | Online summary sheet, signed and dated by you, the applicant (or by the parents of the child where the child is not of an age to sign themselves) - you must ensure that your online application has been fully completed | |
| 2. | Your original passport, valid for at least 6 months after your date of departure from Ireland | |
| 3. | One recent passport size photo | |
| 4. | Evidence of your permission to remain in the UK (stamp or sticker in passport or on other approved official document provided by the UK authorities or a UK Identity Card), valid for at least 3 months after your date of departure from Ireland | |
| 5. | Original long form birth certificate showing the names of both parents (a photo copy or scanned copy is not acceptable) | |
| 6. | Written consent of both parents (as named on the birth certificate). If one parent has sole guardianship, the original court order or a sworn affidavit stating that sole guardianship has been awarded must be provided | |
| 7. | Original (or certified copies) photo id for both parents, as named on the birth certificate, which includes their signatures | |
| 8. | If you state on your application form that you will be travelling with an | |
| (a) | EU family member, you must provide proof that you are travelling together, such as travel documents or accommodation booking showing the names of all those travelling. | |
| (b) | If you are visiting your EU family member in Ireland, you must provide documentary proof that they are in the State such as current | |

| 8. | For postal applications, a self addressed Special Delivery envelope for return of your passport and documents | |
| | Note: If you state on your application form that you will be travelling with your EU family member, the visa will be issued as "C Visit Accompanying EU Family Member". If you then travel without your EU Family Member, you may be stopped by the Immigration Officers on arrival, refused entry and/or have a visa warning entered on your passport. | |
