

**Documentation required when applying for a visa to travel to Ireland  
for an exam or interview**

**PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL DOCUMENTS LISTED BELOW  
MUST BE INCLUDED WITH THE APPLICATION  
AS INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

**All documents listed must be original unless stated otherwise.  
All documents must be in English or  
accompanied by a notarised translation**

1.	Online summary sheet, signed and dated by you, the applicant – you must ensure that your online application has been fully completed	
2.	Your original passport, valid for 6 months after your date of departure from Ireland	
3.	One recent passport size photo	
4.	Evidence of your permission to remain in the UK (stamp or sticker in passport or on other approved official document provided by the UK authorities or a UK Identity Card), valid for at least 3 months after your date of departure from Ireland	
5.	Processing fee (postal orders or bank drafts should be made payable to the Embassy of Ireland) Note: For postal applications, payment should be made by postal order or bank draft only.	
6.	Full details of the reason for your visit ( exam or interview etc)	
7.	<b>Interview Only:</b> An original up to date signed letter on official headed paper from the proposed employer confirming that you are attending for interview, details of the position, date and time of the interview and outlining who is responsible for the costs of the trip (travel, accommodation, expenses etc) Note: The letter should be dated within the 4 week period immediately prior to your date of application.	
8.	<b>Exam Only:</b> Letter of acceptance of registration for the exam from the school/college, confirming the nature and date of the exam Note: The letter should be dated within the 4 week period immediately prior to your date of application.

(b)	<b>Exam Only:</b> Evidence that the required fees have been paid in the form of an official receipt from the school/college	
(c)	<b>Exam Only:</b> Qualification certificates	
9.	<b>Exam &amp; Interview:</b> Evidence of obligation to return to your country of permanent residence (e.g. letter from current employer or college) Note: The letter should be dated within the 4 week period immediately prior to your date of application.	
10.	If you are responsible for the costs of the trip, evidence of how you intend to finance your trip and support yourself for the duration of your visit in the form of up to date bank statements for the 3 month period prior to your visit. Bank Statements should include the most recent transactions for the account up to the date of your application and: (i) must be original (ii) must show your current address and	

	(iii) must show a credit balance of at least £250. Lump sum lodgements made shortly before your application will not be considered. Note: ATM receipts are not accepted.	
11.	Details of any previous applications you have made for an Irish visa including those refused.	
12.	If you have been refused a visa for any other country details of this should be submitted.	
13.	For postal applications, a self addressed Special Delivery envelope for return of your passport and documents
