Dear Sir / Madam

I refer to your recent request for a reissue of a Foreign Births Registration or Entry (FBR/E) certificate.

A FBR/E certificate is a most important document and must be kept in a safe and secure place, separate from the Irish passport. The Department of Foreign Affairs in Dublin and Irish Embassies are increasingly concerned about the growing number of foreign born Irish citizens who are seeking replacements for certificates that have been lost or stolen.

If you are sure that the certificate is actually missing, then to enable this office to locate the exact entry and re-issue replacement certificate you will need to submit:

1. The enclosed application form fully completed
- 2 A Letter with a Full explanation as to what happened to the Cert.
- 3 Original birth certificate, showing full name, date and place of birth.
(For South African certificates the 'Vault' copy must be provided)
- 4 A copy of his current passport (or some official form of identification)
- 5 A copy of the original FBE certificate if available
- 6 An administration fee of £11.
- 7 If the FBR/E certificate was stolen you should also submit a police report that specifically refers to its theft.

Applications for replacement certificates can take some time to process, **especially where the information requested is not supplied.** If you have any further queries, please do not hesitate to contact me on 020 7235 2171 (extension 535).
